Furthermore, the Academy aims to register all its chemistry students for ChemNet (aged 14-19), which can provide them with careers information and online help with tricky chemistry topics.

The Director looks back at his long teaching experience and success at the Academy

The Director, Dr Andrew Sergis, has been teaching students since 1995, when he had his first student, and during that time has inspired and helped students achieve their aspirations and career ambitions, enabling them to become successful professionals in Society. Some of his past students have become Science, Maths and English teachers in secondary and primary schools, medical doctors & practitioners, nurses, scientists, lawyers, solicitors, pharmacists, opticians and ophthalmologists. Furthermore, he has also helped many mature students enter university, prospective school teachers pass their PGCE exams and those in employment pass their promotional examinations, including electricians, engineers and firemen. Dr Sergis' long career has included working as a Research Fellow and Lecturer at various universities & colleges, school teacher at various schools and Senior Research Officer at Hammersmith Hospital, before he founded Dr Sergis Academy in 2000. As a result of its success and popularity over the years as a teaching centre, the business became a limited company in 2006 and has now expanded to its present site.

Furthermore, the Academy is hoping to take on undergraduates for part-time employment to increase their work experience and boost their chances for employment when they graduate.

Dr Sergis has renewed his qualification as a First Aider after passing a week's course in July at St John's Ambulance, entitled First Aid at Work. He also took a course on fire management in the workplace at St John's Ambulance and has become a qualified Fire Marshall. He intends to encourage future staff at the Academy to become first aiders, as he believes the health and safety of both staff and students should be a priority for any educational centre.

The Mayor of Enfield Honours Dr Sergis

In June 30th 2014, Dr Sergis attended a Governor's award ceremony at the Dugdale Centre in Enfield Town where he received a certificate from the Mayor of Enfield. The award presentation was in recognition for his long service and valuable contributions as a School Governor. Over the years, Dr Sergis served as School Governor at three schools: Cuckoo Hall Primary School, Keys Meadow Primary School and Enfield County Secondary School. He began his role as a School Governor at Cuckoo Hall in September 2001, shortly before the new headmistress was appointed, when the school was not performing well. He then served under the new headmistress, Mrs Patricia Sowter, who was herself later recognized by the Government and awarded a CBE from the Queen in 2011 for her outstanding work in improving and promoting educational standards at the school. As School Governor, Dr Sergis also contributed to the establishment and building of a new primary school in Tysoe Avenue in Enfield, which he helped name as Keys Meadow, based on the local history of the area. As a member of the board of interviewers, he helped to interview and short-list the current headmaster, Lawrence Price. At the inaugural opening of the school in October 15th 2003, he and Mrs Sergis, together with his colleagues, met the Queen, who unveiled a plaque during the opening ceremony. At Enfield County Secondary School (from September 2009), he served under Ms Pam Rutherford, the headmistress, with whom he again worked hard in helping to promote standards at the school.
